MINUTES OF COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON FRIDAY 20TH MAY 2011

AT 53 SHARPENHOE ROAD, BARTON-LE-CLAY

Present: Dee Brockway (Social Walks), Norman Corrin (Secretary), John Nickerson (Treasurer), Nigel Schofield (Chairman), Gordon Shaughnessy and Lynn Yorston

Nigel welcomed everyone and thanked Dee for hosting the meeting at Schloss Brockway (or should that be Uncle Toms Cabin?).

1. Apologies – Steve Clark, Kevin Lamming, Gill Bunker and Merrian Lancaster.

Norman advised the meeting that Kevin Lamming had tendered his resignation but would continue to assist with the production of the newsletter.

(c) Treasurer / Membership - John Nickerson John's report was circulated:

At 19 May 2011 our accounts stand as follows:

Savings A/C = £2199.28

Membership at 19 May11 is 150 including 3 Life members and 15 new members since 2010 AGM.

(Note: At 1 April those members who had not paid were deleted from the list.)

John circulated a copy of the accounts and confirmed that the accounts were now virtually up to date, but there would always be a slight variance of credit up and down. There were 150 members at 19th May 2011, with 15 new members (balanced by a non–renewal from 15 members). At 30th November 2010 there were 164 members.

He said that group's finances were in a very healthy position and distributed a revised membership list with contact co-ordinates.

Nigel thanked John for his report.

(d) Social Walks - Dee Brockway

Dee read her report.

Well that's all done! The BBN social walks programme up to the end of this year, 2011 is now complete! I sent Gill the finished result for August to December last week, she has spotted my deliberate errors, corrected them, and input the programme onto the website. Strider will take the information from the site for publication in their next, August 2011 edition. As you probably all know, we had a little hiccup with publication of our February BBN newsletter; in-so-much as it went out for distribution minus the walks programme. Thanks to Merrian, and all concerned for emailing or posting to all members, a separate copy. To avoid repetition of our mistake, I will email the programme to Steve C. and ask him to include it as an integral part of the newsletter, rather than as an insert.

I haven't worked out all the statistics yet, you have to wait until the AGM for that exciting information, but I think I can say, with some certainly, that the number of walks we have been able to offer this year, has, in simple numbers of events, surpassed my other years 'in charge'. At least 3 new leaders Michael Mooney, Teresa Brown and Chris Burns have already very successfully led their first walks this year and there are a couple more new names to come. Following another of Phil Hastings' excellent joint walks with our neighbours Essex and Herts, Paul and Suzanne Flynn will help to strengthen our ties and friendships with another group, Thames Valley, when they lead a joint walk from Stone, near Aylesbury in September. Even partners of regular walks leaders, i.e. Dave Norris (Sylvie's other half) have been cajoled into the act and, by the sound of his walk title, he may include tea and biscuits for us all! November and December will be filled, in part, by the usual regular events, namely the AGM walk, Shillington Shuffle (marshals and the main event) and that man in red and white, Santa Claus, who insists on testing out our festive vocal chords every December. Watch out also for another Chris Dent's Boxing Day special, to blow away the Christmas cobwebs. and/or the extra pounds.

I am happily now accepting offers to lead walks for our next programme, January to April 2012. As always please book a slot asap and provide the usual final details by 10th September please.

So, absolutely lots to look forward to: over to our members for their next set of ideas and offers.

Nigel thanked Dee for her report and said that the group was in debt to her for the walk programme that everyone in BBN enjoyed. There was always a need for walk leaders new and not so new.

(e) Merchandising/Equipment - Lynn Yorston

Merchandising

Lynn advised the meeting that there was nothing to report on merchandising and that the garments available had yet to be uploaded onto the BBN website.

Equipment

Lynn advised the meeting that the following equipment had been purchased from the approved sum of £150.00: Berco Boiler, 2 large catering tea pots, 1 smaller tea pot, 9 large plastic jugs and 3 kettles. It was agreed that this equipment could be used by any club member but MUST be returned to the location from where it was collected and clean.

(f) Website - Merrian Lancaster

Norman confirmed that the BBN website was 'live' and that there would be a generic email address on the LDWA National website e.g. secretary@......

Gordon proposed and it was agreed to co-opt David Findel-Hawkins onto the Committee to act as Membership Secretary until the AGM in November.

(g) Newsletter - Steve Clark

Norman advised that the next issue of the BBN newsletter would be towards the end of July and that the deadline for items was 22nd June.

(h) Local Group Representative - Nigel Schofield

Nigel said he had nothing to report.

(Note: The Chairman acting as clerk: Subsequent to this Committee meeting the date of the LDWA Local Groups Meeting in 2011 has once again been arranged on the weekend of our November Challenge. As I did not attend last year I think that it would be best if we were represented. I will go and please may I do the marshals' walk on the weekend before?)

(i) Other Committee Members

No item was raised for discussion.

4. Insurance Issues - Incident Reports

Norman passed on advice from the National Committee in that anyone organising a walking holiday (weekend or longer) should not be responsible for both travel/transport and accommodation. If you were not ATOL or ABTA then there would be problems in the event of an accident or claim by a third party. The best would be for all participants to organise their own travel and accommodation unless it was more economical to do group travel.

5. Group Activities

(a) Social Events

There were no positive suggestions at the moment but a proposal was made to put on a walk followed by an 'event' All proposals considered folks!

(b) 2011 Hundred CP - Norman Corrin

Norman advised the Committee that he would send out notes for CP1 at Amestry to all helpers.

(c) 2012 Hundred

Norman confirmed that there would be an article in August Strider. Still need volunteers for CP3, other duties on the event and the Marshals' event.

2012 100 Marshals' Event - Lynn Yorston

Lynn was pleased to report that the Marshals' event was coming together very well and good all round progress had been made.

(d) 2013 Hundred CP – Devon and Cornwall – Norman Corrin

No update other than BBN are still at CP3.

(e) Bedford Walking Festival - Norman Corrin

Norman was pleased to confirm that BBN would put on a walk on Thursday 8th September as part of the Festival and that Colin Scargill may be the leader. Start is at Marston Vale Country Park. Please take part if you can on this alternative Thursday walk.

There would also be a two day walk to complete The Greensand Way as part of the Festival.

With regard to the offer by Barry Ingram of assistance with a walk on the Greensand Ridge Trail Norman confirmed that this was not part of the Festival and could be any time of year. It was agreed that Norman will follow this up with Barry, provisionally to walk the route over two consecutive days on one of the last two weekends of September 2011.

6. BBN Events

(a) Chiltern Kanter - Sunday 27th February 2011 - Norman Corrin

Due to the clash with the Winter Poppyline 50 the numbers were down by 24 from 192 to 168. This was better than expected. I've done the results for the June newsletter complete with results for the marshals walk. Everyone seemed to enjoy it despite the bad weather but there were a few retirements.

I've set out the statistics below:

I've calculated we made a surplus of £387.71 but I am awaiting confirmation from John.

I'm willing to organise again in 2013 when I hope to find another venue just like I did this year but didn't. It will revert back to the first weekend in March even if there is a clash with the national AGM!

(b) Shillington Shuffle

This event is under sound 'management' and progressing well, 3 routes of 26, 17 and 12 miles, Sunday 13th November with the Marshals' walk on Sunday 6th November – fireworks? More information and entry form in the July Newsletter. This will be the first of a triple challenge in three years.

(c) Pick & Mix - Lynn Yorston

Lynn reported that all was on course for the 2012 Pick and Mix – date to be confirmed but either 26th February or 4th March, there will be a new 12, 6 and 5 mile route.

(d) 30th Anniversary

Norman advised that there were two possible 30 mile challenges for our 30th Anniversary; the Nene Valley Kanter and all or part of the Aylesbury Ring. This would leave Bedfordshire to provide a 30 mile walk to make the unique 3 x 30 triple challenge.

(Note: The Chairman after this meeting acting as clerk thought of adding Shillington Shuffle to part of Steppingly Step as in a figure of 8 with two legs of 15 miles.)

7. Group Finances/Donations/Equipment Norman's report:

Suggestions for donations are so far

- Donate a gate form from The Chiltern Society which DFH sent me
- Dave Findel-Hawkins and Merrian Lancaster have sent me a form about the Wendover Arm
 Trust which has commissioned new traditional style attractive wooden footbridges to go over
 the Arm near Whitehouse. We can help sponsor the canal restoration work and in return have
 a plaque permanently fixed to one of the bridges displaying the groups' name.
- Dave Findel-Hawkins suggested we erect a gate to celebrate either the LDWA's 40th Anniversary or BBN's 30th Anniversary.
- A donation to the Greensand Ridge Trail as it was their 25th Anniversary year.
- Logo engraved on the paving stone at Wordsworth Daffodil Gardens in Lake District.

According to last committee meeting minutes this was to be held over until the Chiltern Kanter had been held. As we made a surplus can we decide which one of these to go ahead with or should we postpone it pending any request for additional loans for the LDWA Game 100 in 2102?

Norman suggested that the Group might like to consider a donation or two donations of £250 to support one new kissing gate to the Chiltern Society (with due recognition to BBN – LDWA) and perhaps a 'brick' on a bridge on the Wendover Arm Canal.
