Ian and Cynthia McLeod have manned the Clendon Cross Roads checkpoint for a number of years now. When I was discussing the arrangements with Ian for this year he said "it has never rained when we have been manning that checkpoint". The weather for the 1989 event was overcast with the threat of rain any time with just a few spots in the air every now and again but it never came to anything so Ian can regard his record as remaining intact. The day was mild and, in spite of heavy rain in the days prior to the event, underfoot conditions were dry judging by the clean footwear presented at the finish. Overall ideal conditions for walking.

Out of the 123 entries there were 109 who set off from Henley Fort between 9.30 a.m. and midday. Unfortunately the traditional exit from Henley fort across the field and through the gap in the hedge was not available because the gap in the hedge has been blocked up so participants had to make the detour via the main exit to gain access to the chalky track. As the same detour had to be made at the end of the walk this added quite a significant distance to the walk. Another difficulty early in the walk was the A3 road workings at the bridge near Compton but thanks to Tony Cartwright's way marking the difficulty was easily overcome.

There were 101 who completed the 20 mile route in times ranging from the fleet of foot Erik Falck-Therkelsen in 3 hours 11 minutes to the more leisurely pace of a group who came to be known as the "Red Devils" by the marshals because of their vivid red tee shirts who took over 9 hours. I might say they appeared to be intent on visiting every pub on route but unfortunately having visited the Ship, the Fox and Hounds and the Green Man the pubs closed so they could not manage to visit the Bull.

My thanks once again to all those who helped dispense drinks and check the participants out, through and in. A drink and few cheery words from the officials at the checkpoints is always welcome and great encouragement to those who are not used to walking this distance.
