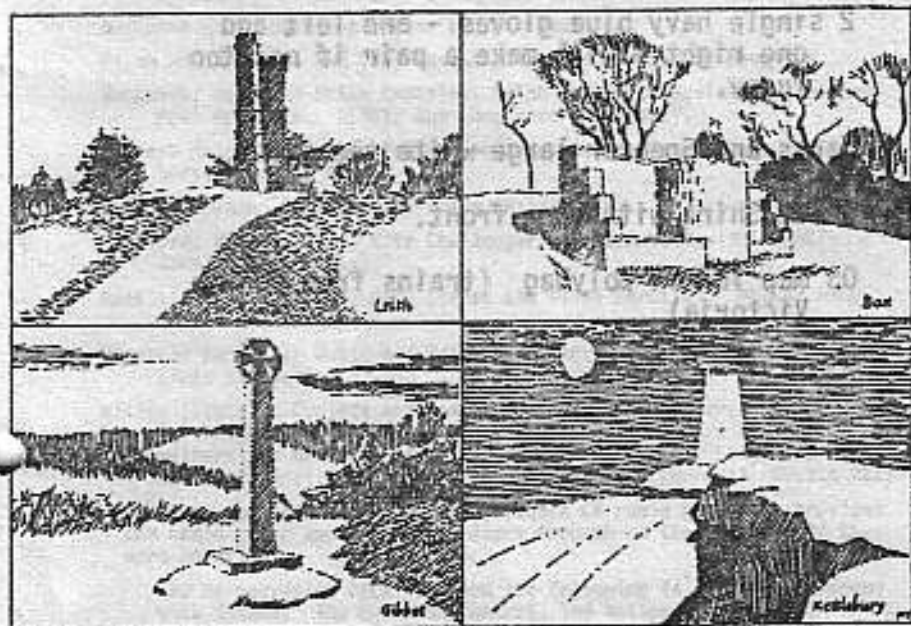

## REPORT ON THE ELEVENTH SURREY SUMMITS

It made a change to have the venue for the Surrey Summits at the King Edwards School Cricket Pavillion but not a very good one. It was a change forced upon us unfortunately but all made the best of the cramped conditions and it will serve to make us appreciate the better facilities at Chichester Hall when we return there for our venue on the twelfth Surrey Summits over the weekend of 4/5 April 1987.

Chris Steer, now acting in his traditional role of official starter, pointed out there were over half the entrants who had not completed a Surrey Summits before and wished them luck in a tone which implied they needed it. As Chris got the walkers under way at 10am the 181 starters proceeded sedately down the sandy track with just a slight hiccup where a queue started forming to get through the barrier at the entrance to the narrow footpath then after successfully withstanding the hazards of the A283 without losing any the walkers got down to the serious business of "bagging" checkpoints.

The weather was mild enough and, during the afternoon mainly dry with a few showers which inclined to be heavy at times but I did not see many wearing waterproofs.

The 181 starters increased to a record 182 when one entrant started an hour late having fallen victim to British rail delays on his journey to Witley.

All got through Hascombe Hill and the new manned checkpoint at Pitch Hill Car Park but we got three who decided to pack it in before they got to Westcott. It was indeed a pity for them to miss out the checkpoint at 2 Milton Farm Cottages. To have found a person as amiable as Ray Bardsley living in a house so convenient to the route is a great find. Some walkers expressed concern about muddy boots over Ray's carpet but they need not have worried. The carpet was "an old one" put temporarily there by Ralph Henley although I must confess it looked better than the one I have in my front room.



After the short respite in the comfort of sitting by an open fire it was on to the eastern loop which is probably the toughest part of the route with the ascents of Ramore, Box Hill and Mickleham Down coming close together. Then on to sample the hospitality of Graham Peddie and his crew at Tanners Hatch Youth Hostel.

The showers which had been a feature of the weather in the afternoon died out altogether during the evening which probably encouraged one or two who would otherwise have retired to continue. Even so the biggest number of retirements took place as darkness was falling or just after with two-thirds of those who retired doing so at Ramore, Shalford or on the route between.

The pavillion at Shalford Park was also another new location for a manned checkpoint which was forced

upon us because Henley Port was not available. Even so the Hogs back is one of the Summits so the route still had to go up there.

John Robinson had his usual fire going at the Hankley Common checkpoint which was very much appreciated by the walkers. It cause many to linger while to such an extent that the marshals had a job to accommodate everyone with so many staying there for long periods.

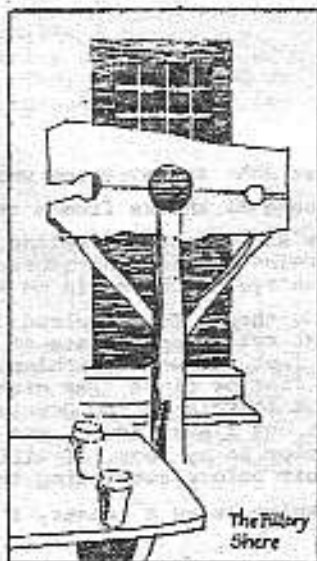
Even though Hindhead Youth Hostel was just as inviting walkers are usually determined (or resigned) to finish by the time they get her so they are more interest in getting on with the job than to soak up the comforts provided. There was a little difficulty with conjection for the later walkers when the hostellers got up but Molly and Margaret coped very well without any mishap.

As seems to happen so often the best weather came on Sunday morning with sunrise in the Devil's Punchbowl really splendid. I walked the route from Hindhead to Witley in the company of some of the later walkers and found it delightful to walk over Gibbet Hill in such ideal conditions. I was probably in a better position to enjoy it than my companions having not walked the rest of the route. We were lucky though because soon after the walk finished at midday the weather deteriorated and by mid afternoon heavy steady rain had set in. What price the sceptics who doubted my statement in a Winter Tanners report that the Surrey Group can influence the weather.

It was probably as well that the weather did hold good for us because we would have had great difficulty in coping with so many people if they all wanted to stay inside. As it was everything went well. Ian McLeod, acting in his now traditional role of head breakfast waiter (without a bow tie one of the members of the organizing committee complained) did comment that walkers behaved themselves very considerately. When they had finished their breakfast they vacated their seats to allow later arrivals to sit down to their meal without being asked.

There were 130 who finished, again a record. First in were Richard Brown and Alan Ireland in a record time of 14 hours 33 minutes having satisfied Jeff Ellingham they had adhered to the "walking only". They finished more than one and a half hours ahead of the rest of the field and this pattern had emerged early on the walk with Richard using the checkpoint opening times to pace himself. The conditions, even though muddy in places, tended to favour Richard's road walking style while Alan had to be paced to keep up. On one occasion when Jeff Ellingham was observing them coming down a long straight he could not see Alan and thought he had fallen behind but as they got nearer Jeff saw Alan tucked in behind Richard using the slip stream.

Bill Grace and Martyn Greaves notched up another successful Surrey Summits to keep their 100% record having completed a eleven Surrey Summits events. In fact the top nine in the completion table who entered this years event all finished so the order stays the same with one additional completion all round - its tough at the top.



The Kent Group retained the Leith Trophy easily with 15 of their members finishing. After the shock of only just getting the trophy in 1985, Brian Buttifant made a special effort to ensure he got Kent members to enter the event. I must admit the present system of awarding the trophies does favour the home counties groups. The Gibbet trophy goes to Central London YHA who were just ahead of last years winners, Slough Casuals, by having the faster aggregate time for their three finishers.

Many appreciative letters have been received from walkers of the way they were looked after by the marshals. The same ones come back year after year so I suppose they must enjoy it.

If you were successful I trust you will want to repeat the performance next year and if not I assume you will be determined not to let the challenge get the better of you. Either way I hope to see you next year - 2 weeks before Easter.

Dear John,

Firstly I would like to offer my thanks for a greatly challenging and, in retrospect, rewarding walk. I was pleasantly surprised how picturesque Surrey and its environs are.

Secondly I know you welcome comments, so I would like to add that I had just 2 gripes. In regard to checkpoints I felt that the 10 mile gaps between the two manned checkpoints after Tanners Hatch was a little far considering the length of time the majority had been walking for, and of course the effects of the lack of sleep. It did provide a tough psychological challenge knowing that there was such a gap. Obviously logistics and access are the major considerations here, but perhaps one every 7 miles might have been an improvement. I must add that the hospitality at the checkpoints was excellent, especially with open fires.

We encountered only one ambiguity, in the otherwise first class route description, at TQ 101491. Upon entering the National Trust owned area the instruction was given to continue along the path for 180m (I think) and then TL. There was no mention of the stile that had to be crossed before TL. Further, if the path was followed for a few metres more, upon crossing another stile into the next National Trust area a track appeared to descend left also. This confusion did result in a few minutes anguish until resorting to scouting tactics, we followed footprints. At this stage I must thank fellow walker wearing the trainers with the very distinctive studded footprints! They were spotted at the initial stile and further down, what turned out to be, the correct path.

ORGANIZER'S COMMENT: We try to keep the running of the Surrey Summits within the Surrey Group and those who help come from Surrey Group members or our immediate associates. We have kept it to 6 or 7 checkpoints because this is the number we think we can manage. Having so few manned checkpoints on a 62 mile route means there are going to be long gaps between some in places where suitable locations are not available where we would like them. The committee are aware of the desirability of reducing the distance between manned checkpoints at the critical time during the hours of darkness and look for ways of doing this but it is unlikely we will change our policy to increase the number of manned checkpoints
