REPORT AND RESULTS OF THE WINTER TANNERS WALK - 11th January 1981

As the 141 walkers set off from Leatherhead football club, the sun rose on what was to turn out to be a fine but cold day. We were very fortunate bearing in mind that the day was sendwiched between a very wet Saturday

and Monday.

Overnight frost made the ground hard and the going easy at first.Walkers speeded along Stane Street much to the surprise of golfers having an early morning round from Tyrrells Wood. As the winter sun made itself felt, the mud began to manifest and make conditions a little more difficult. This was particularly noticeable along the lower slopes between Reigate and Buckland hills where trying to walk on a slippery slope caused a few to get down and have a closer look at the route. Although I thought I had catered for the fastest, one runner went through checkpoint one and about half a dozen through checkpoint two before they opened. Most however took it at a more leisurely pace and took full advantage of the hot drinks at the checkpoints. Ceoff Feck was first home in 3 hours 48 minutes 35 seconds. In all 124 completed the full route with 13 getting back to Leatherhead by taking a short cut. Three dogs were declared as having completed the course but there were one or two more who were not officially registered.

Many said they enjoyed the route which, unusually for the 30 miler, wentmainly to the east of the A24. Parts of it were familiar to those who
have taken part in the 50 but its nice to take a look at the scenery
approaching from the opposite direction. The route was devised by Alan
Blatchford but he did express a doubt about whether it was a full 30
miles. I did lengthen it a bit but I feel it still falls a little short.
In view of its popularity, I have no hesitation in recommending to the
Tanners Farathon Association that they adopt the route for the summer

event, subject to extending it by about a mile.

Those I spoke to said they could follow the route description in the main but nearly everybody gave at least one place where they had difficulty. The main places where people went wrong seems to have been Headley Heath and Box Hill. I appreciate the comments given and hopefully they will have to improve the points of the least the comments.
