After the controversial decision of the Surrey Group not to hold the Winter Tammers in 1990, this popular event was restored to the LDWA programme for this year. It had been intended that the event should be held every other year but the protestations of critics seem to have won through because it is now intended that the annual status of the event be restored for the forseeable future.

The Winter Tanners, although now an event in its own right, is also a route proving exercise for The Tanners Marathon to be held on the first Sunday in July and therefore the route is decided by where the route of the summer event goes. I took over the responsibility for devising the route of the Tanners Marathon for the 1990 event. There was, as previously stated, no Winter Tanners last year, so 1991 was the first year Winter Tanners walkers were to sample a route of mine. I tried to make it a little different and in particular pandered to the whims of those who have been suggesting that the area to the east of the A24 should be exploited for a Tanners route. The big difficulty with using that area is that the available unurbanized area is not big enough for a logical 30 mile route without going east of the A217 or south of the A25 and finding points at which busy roads can be crossed with safety tends to restrict the choice of paths which can be used.

The 1991 route had 3 notable firsts for a Winter Tammers. It went further east then any previous route, it went through Leatherhead town on the way out and it did not pass Tammers Hatch Youth Hostel. The latter point was not intended as the route planned included a drinks point at Tanmers as usual but unfortunately Graham Peddie was engaged in other activities on 13th January so could not provide the service. This meant I had to re-arrange the locations of the other checkpoints at the last minute and to divert the route to visit Headley Village Hall. This diversion involved an increase in distance of about three quarters of a mile and the most convenient point at which I could make a short cut on the quick to compensate for the additional distance was to miss out the intended diversion off the track from Rammore to Bagden Farm to visit Tammers. The route had more tarmac walking than I would have liked

which I tried to avoid, especially the walk through Tadworth, but I did not manage to find a logical alternative bearing in mind I wanted to use the pedestrian lights to cross the A217. Another undesirable feature was the predominance of the M25 but I'm afraid again this texts to be unavoidable if the route goes to the east of the A24. However all the participants I spoke to said they enjoyed the route even though they shared my view that they would have preferred the tarmsc walking to have been reduced. Many commented on the nice open views on the North Downs Way section. One other point of comment was the "sting in the tail". I must admit that when I was planning the route I was thinking that I will be critisized for making it too flat so I was rather glad to find that there was a nice hilly section I could use to put the finishing touches to the route. Perhaps I over did it coming in the last 10 miles of the walk and it certainly spoiled the complacency of many who anticipated doing a good time after the first 20 miles.

We were also very lucky with the weather. Up to the Thursday before the event we had high winds and heavy rain but the weather cleared up for the weekend and bright sumshine was predominent for the day itself to show the Surrey Hills off to best effect. A hard overnight frost also meant that there was very little mud because in spite of the sum shining it was not warm enough to penetrate frosty ground so apart from a few sheltered tracks it stayed hard underfoot all day. One effect of this though was when the sum began to go down it started to freeze again and this made the steep grassy slope on Box Hill leading down to Burford Bridge very slippery and one or two took a tumble including myself.

Unfortunately I had a domestic problem on the morning of the event and then I had difficulty getting into my car for frozen locks which delayed me getting to the start. I did just manage to get there by 7.30 though by which time Ken Styan and Dave Green, who have helped me do the start registration for a number of years now, had set a lot of pre-day entrants off. The only piece of paper that Ken could find to record those who had left did tend to make it look like a poverty stricken event but at least it achieved the object. The on day entrants had to wait a little longer for the organiser to get organised before they could go so it just shows that it can be advantageous to send your entry in besides being cheaper and helping the organiser.

Of the 175 pre day entrants 139 made the starting line and there were 52 entrants on the day to make a total of 191 who set out from the car perk on the route of the 1991 Winter Tanners. Mervy Harvey, who was taking the hot soup and cold drinks to the Banstead Wood checkpoint, had a breakdown on the motorway travelling to the checkpoint so he was a little late there but he only missed one or two people who arrived at the checkpoint just on the opening time. However most participants appreciated the refreshments on offer at both Banstead Wood and Headley. Some also took advantage of the refreshment kiosk being open at the Gatton Park car park.

There were 177 who arrived back at Leatherhead having finished the whole route in times ranging from 4 hours 56 minute to 11 hour 43 minutes. Times generally tended to be on the slow side no doubt because of the steep climbs in the last 10 miles. Some said it was such a lovely day they just wanted to take it easy. From what I can gather many of those

who did not qualify for a certificate merely took a short cut because they felt they were taking too long.

Once again I would like to extend my thanks to those who helped with registration and supplying the drinks. Those who helped are mainly regulars and know the system well. Just David Fee and Jeff Campbell were making their first appearance as helpers on The Winter Tanners - Jeff is assisting on one or two events while recovering from an injury.
