7. Secretary's report

The circulation of our monthly newsletter has been steadily increasing throughout the year, with the latest edition being sent to over 500 recipients for the first time. Thank you to everyone who has contributed to it.

I recently spent a weekend representing the group at the LDWA Local Groups' Weekend just outside Chatham in Kent. The weekend was thoroughly enjoyable throughout. There were workshops on both evenings to discuss matters such as the grading of walks, using social media, sharing places where groups shop, Strider content and rewarding members. There was a choice of walks on Saturday. Sunday morning was spent in a meeting, where the following were discussed:

- Date protection Groups will need to appoint a data protection officer. This can be one of the existing committee members, probably the group secretary.
- Group chairs will assume the additional role of Safeguarding Officer. This addresses the need to protect any vulnerable individuals on our walks.
- Cost saving measures, including groups being expected to raise funds for important/essential projects that the LDWA has planned, including the urgent upgrade of the IT;
- Groups will be required by the LDWA's insurers, to complete a register of those taking part in their walks, which will need to be kept for 3 years;
- Groups will be invited to help carry out footpath repairs on long distance paths that are not national trails, as the latter already receive funding;
- We also discussed how the LDWA can help protect the environment. Options include the withdrawal of single use plastics from all our challenge events, and printing Strider on recyclable paper;
- The one-stop shop for organising 100s, which will be published shortly; and
- The new LDWA logo You are invited to vote for one of the options shown in the latest edition of Strider magazine.

A lot of hard work is going into the running of the LDWA at a national level, with a lot of hard decisions being made to ensure the LDWA is ready for the next 50 years. I was impressed by what I heard, particularly the rationale for the choice of logos, and I look forward to attending next year.

Finally, throughout the weekend I was asked whether the Wiltshire 50 would become a regular event, and a qualifying event for the Hundred. There was strong support from the NEC members and the other group representatives, with neighbouring groups offering to run checkpoints.

11a. Shropshire Hills Weekend

Following the success of the Exmoor weekend, it is proposed that the group goes to Shropshire next year. The details are as follows:

- Date: 18th 21st October 2019
- Location: HF, Church Stretton, Shropshire
- Full Board: 3 x dinners, 3 x breakfasts and 2 x packed lunches
- Accommodation: Licenced bar. Ensuite rooms with tea/coffee-making facilities
- Walks: 3 days walking plus evening activities
- Cost: £240 per person (may be less depending on numbers of attendees)
- Deposit: £75 per person to be paid by 7th February 2019

11c. Mid Wilts Way

As its name implies, this is a 68-mile long trek that goes right through the heart of our home county of Wiltshire. It starts at Ham (near the border with Berkshire) and heads west then south to end up at Mere, close to the Somerset border

It lends itself to 3 sections:

- Ham to Knap Hill car park (22 miles)
- Knap Hill to Steeple Ashton (22 miles)
- Steeple Ashton to Mere (24 miles)

The proposal is that group members walk it over three Sundays next summer, parking our cars at the day's destination and hiring a minibus to the start

11d. Attracting New Members

It was proposed that to maximise the recruitment potential of any publicity, local & national, resulting from our gate donation in Mark's memory and as a longer-term recruitment ploy, the group should encourage walk leaders to include <u>some</u> full-length social walks with the option of shorter routes, e.g. a 20-mile walk with a 10-mile option. The objective is to encourage new walkers to join us then move up to our full-length walks. Also to cater better for our existing members who now find 20 miles too far. This is already planned by other local groups, including South Wales, Thames Valley and Heart of England to our knowledge and has been debated by the NEC. It can be achieved by walks split into loops or figure 8s or by running two separate walks from the same starting point. There is no suggestion of any fewer full-length walks or that all walks should have this option or of there being a directive on the subject. Opinions varied. It was therefore decided that, the point having been raised, individual walk leaders should be free as always to choose their own routes.
